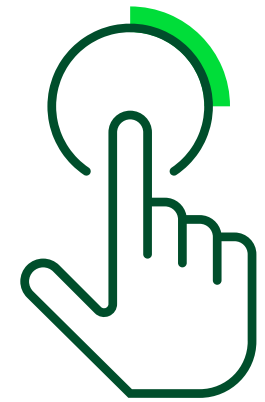

Employees in action



Our team in the Southeast Region was named Wake County Soil and Water Conservation District's 2024 Big Sweep Partner of the Year, recognizing Heidelberg Materials North America's 13-year commitment to the Big Sweep cleanup program.

The Big Sweep is a long-standing volunteer effort focused on protecting local watersheds and improving water quality at Lake Crabtree. Since the program began in 2006, volunteers have removed more than 533,000 pounds of litter, with over 166,000 pounds recycled—a meaningful impact supported by many of our employees throughout the years.

Our involvement extended beyond taking part in cleanup events. Teams donated materials, equipment, and logistical support, and made sure volunteers stayed fueled with meals. Recent contributions included a storage trailer, six canoes, ten kayaks, paddles, life vests, and updated branded signage to support the initiative.

This recognition also reflected the region's ongoing dedication, including the successful completion of its fifth cleanup of 2025, made possible by employees who consistently show up for their communities.



Northeast Region | Flourtown, PA Team

Volunteers partnered with Camp Woods Preserve to advance local wildlife conservation efforts. The team worked hard removing invasive plants, re-securing tree netting, and clearing excess stakes - preparing the site for an upcoming restoration planting with a local school.



Southwest Region | Readymix Team

In 2025, our Houston Ready Mix team launched their Day of Service program with groups volunteering at the Houston Food Bank. The group helped prep both hot and cold meals to be distributed by the Food Bank.



Northeast Region | Allentown Office

Our Allentown, PA, Northeast Region office team proudly joined United Way's Day of Caring, partnering with The Salvation Army to support local families. Together, they packed over 400 care packages and assisted with facility improvements—demonstrating our commitment to community and compassion.

Servtex Quarry Annual Community Food Drive



In 2024 and 2025, the Servtex Quarry in the Southwest Region proudly hosted its annual community food drive, bringing together local schools and cities to support the Randolph Area Christian Assistance Program (RACAP) during the critical summer months.

Each year, the drive engages three elementary schools and five surrounding cities, rallying students, families, and community leaders around a shared goal of giving back. Over the two-year period, these annual efforts resulted in a combined 5,701.83 pounds of food donated, helping stock RACAP's shelves and support children and families in need.

The success of this annual initiative reflects strong teamwork—from coordinating banners, flyers, and collection sites to managing pickups and deliveries. To celebrate student involvement, participating schools also added a fun incentive, rewarding top-collecting grade levels with pizza parties.



Our corporate office team and summer interns roll up their sleeves each year to help the Irving Schools Foundation prepare for its “Supplies for Success” back-to-school event. We host a supply drive at the office, then come together to help stuff backpacks and volunteer at the distribution event. We also support the Foundation’s mission through a corporate donation, helping ensure students across Irving start the school year with what they need to succeed.



Northwest Region | Edmonton Office

The Edmonton office held a holiday food drive for the Edmonton Food Bank. A little friendly competition between departments resulted in overflowing boxes of food and a \$3,000 donation to the food bank in 2024.



Corporate Office | Irving, TX

The team at the corporate office in Irving, TX, participates in a toy drive annually supporting the Irving Police & Fire Blue Christmas initiative. Employees collect toys and games for children in need, specifically in the age group of 10 - 17, as the organization has let us know that group is sometimes overlooked during the holiday season.



Northeast Region | Perkiomenville Quarry

In 2025, the team at Perkiomenville Quarry participated in a holiday toy drive hosted by Marlborough Township and its police department. The donations were collected for the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia.

Employee matching

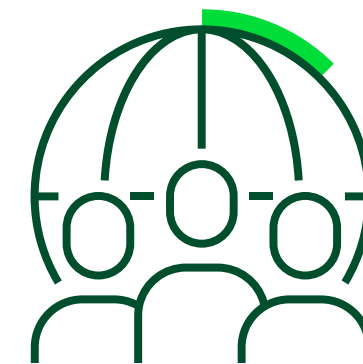
The Employee Matching portion of the Heidelberg Materials Helps program is designed to recognize and support employee contributions to their communities while helping facilitate goodwill in our areas of operation. Through this program, employees are empowered to support charitable causes they care about and extend positive community impact on behalf of the Company.

Heidelberg Materials supports employee philanthropy through a matching gift benefit that provides each employee with up to \$300 in company match per calendar year. Using the HM Helps platform, employees can log in, search for an eligible charitable organization, and make a donation that is matched by the Company, amplifying the impact of their personal commitment to community causes.

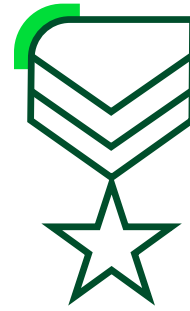

Supporting Veterans



Fisher House Foundation

In 2025, to recognize Veterans Day, Heidelberg Materials North America made a \$20,000 donation to Fisher House Foundation, an organization that provides comfort and housing to military families while their loved ones receive medical care.

Since launching its Military Program in 2021, Heidelberg Materials has more than tripled veteran representation across its operations—reflecting the leadership, resilience, and teamwork veterans bring to the workforce. The company’s VetNet Employee Resource Group continues to play a key role in recruiting, developing, and supporting service members as they transition to civilian careers.

As part of its annual Veterans Day recognition, VetNet members vote each year on a nonprofit to receive the company’s Veterans Day gift. Fisher House was selected for its meaningful and lasting impact on military families and communities.

Through continued investment in veterans and support for organizations that serve military families, Heidelberg Materials remains committed to creating a workplace where veterans can thrive—and to honoring service both inside and outside the company.

Helping Veterans and Families of Indiana Inc.

HVAF of Indiana houses, supports, and advocates for all veterans and their families to help them achieve the best possible quality of life. On October 26, 2024, a catastrophic fire displaced 48 veterans.

Having heard this story, the Heidelberg Materials Midwest Region team looked for a way to help.

Employees in the Indianapolis office and the team at Harding Street Quarry collected most needed items and volunteered.

The company also made a \$2,500 in coordination with VetNet to help support this cause.



Strengthening Communities Through Sports

Heidelberg Materials invests in youth sports because strong communities grow when young people have the support, space and confidence to thrive.

Across North America, many of the communities we serve look to us for help keeping youth sports programs active and accessible. From supporting booster clubs to sponsoring team jerseys, we are proud to play a role in keeping these leagues moving forward.

In Texas, our Servtex Quarry helped Davenport High School enhance school pride by contributing to a new jumbotron for the growing community of Garden Ridge.

In the Midwest, our partnership with Kings United FC helps ensure more children have the chance to play. We have made field space available at our Middlebranch site, creating multiple practice fields and a full size game field for the club. This effort allows around 120 kids to experience the joy of soccer in a supportive environment, fostering teamwork, discipline and personal growth.

Over the past two years, Heidelberg Materials has supported more than 150 youth sports leagues, helping young athletes build confidence, community and lifelong skills in the places we call home.

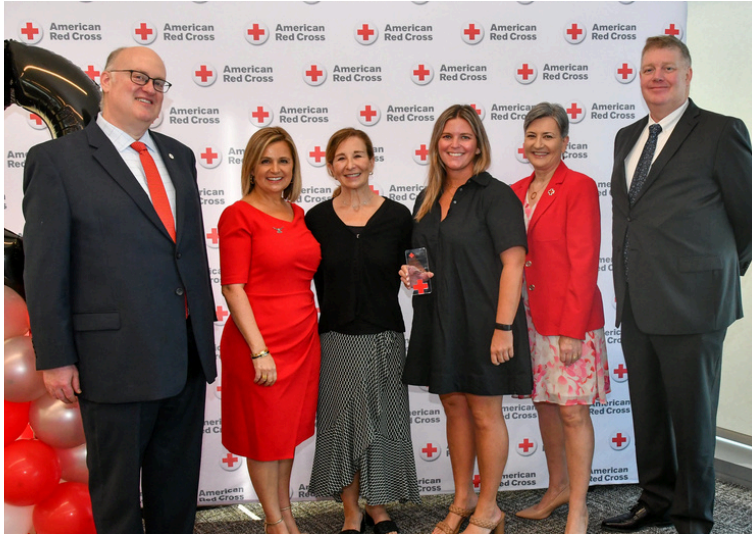


Investing in Disaster Relief

Heidelberg Materials has a long-standing commitment to supporting the American Red Cross and the critical services it provides during times of crisis. When disaster strikes, the Red Cross is often the first to respond, mobilizing volunteers, delivering essential supplies, and offering immediate comfort to communities in need. That mission aligns closely with our values and the way our teams show up for their neighbors.

In both 2024 and 2025, Heidelberg Materials was proud to contribute \$100,000 each year to help the Red Cross continue this vital work. That support became especially meaningful in 2024, when Hurricanes Helene and Milton caused significant damage across the Southeast and directly affected several of our operations. As our teams checked on one another's safety and worked to restore facilities, we saw firsthand how quickly Red Cross volunteers stepped in to provide direction, relief, and stability during an incredibly challenging time.

Our partnership reflects a shared belief: when communities face their hardest moments, organizations like ours have a responsibility—and an opportunity—to make a meaningful difference.



Responding to the Central Texas Floods

In July 2025, Heidelberg Materials stepped up to support Central Texas communities following severe flooding that affected Kerr, Travis, Burnet, and Kendall counties, including the Southwest Region's Burnet Quarry.

Through Heidelberg Materials Helps, the Company donated \$10,000 to the Ark of Lake Highlands and launched a giving campaign on the HM Helps platform.

Employees were invited to join the effort using their annual matching funds, and the Company added an extra \$1,000 once employee donations reached \$2,500—helping bring relief and support to neighbors and colleagues impacted by the flooding.

Southeast Region | Holly Springs Quarry

Our Holly Springs Quarry in North Carolina got a new neighbor in 2025 - Rex Road Elementary. To help mark the occasion, our project team hosted the school's PTA for a behind-the-scenes tour of the quarry, where they handpicked a spirit rock to represent the heart of the new school.

The rock was delivered just in time for students and staff to decorate it before the first day.



Corporate Office | Irving, TX

In 2025, the North America corporate office donated thousands of dollars' worth of furniture to the Irving Schools Foundation. After vacating a floor of the corporate office, gently used furniture was upcycled and repurposed for local schools, including desks for classrooms, furnishings for counselors' offices, chairs for gymnasiums, and office furniture for the Foundation.



Northeast Region | Pittsburgh, PA

Heidelberg Materials proudly sponsored Horsepower Robotics Team 4991, helping students explore their interests in STEM while building technical knowledge, leadership skills, and a spirit of collaboration through participation in FIRST robotics competitions.



Southeast Region | Princeton

Our Princeton, North Carolina, location is proud to have contributed funds and building materials for the Princeton Community Center and Public Library. Opened in 2025, it creates a space in the community where people can connect, learn, and celebrate milestones.



Northeast Region | Johnstown Quarry

We were honored to support the Guardians of Freedom Memorial project through our Johnstown Quarry in Central New York. Over the past few years, Todd Mankouski and our team have dedicated their efforts to bring this vision to life, providing manpower and materials. Midwest Region | Mason City Cement Plant

Heidelberg Materials hosted Iowa Lt. Gov. Chris Cournoyer at its cement plant in Mason City, where she was joined by Colleen Frein, president and CEO of the Mason City Chamber of Commerce. The visit highlighted the facility's 115-year history and its ongoing contributions to the local economy and infrastructure development.

Southeast Region | Sumter, South Carolina

We were a proud sponsor of Sumter, South Carolina's eSTEAM festival featuring hands-on fun while learning about Science, Tech, Engineering, Arts & Math. Attendees of all ages explored careers and advancements while learning about industries and organizations in the region.



Midwest Region | Mitchell Cement Plant

Heidelberg Materials welcomed U.S. Congressman Jefferson Shreve (R-IN-06) and his staff to our state-of-the-art cement plant in Mitchell, Indiana. The visit provided a valuable opportunity to showcase the innovative technologies and sustainable practices driving our operations, focusing on the recently upgraded Mitchell facility.



Northeast Region | Union Bridge Cement Plant

We opened up our Union Bridge, Maryland plant to representatives from Build With Strength, a coalition of the National ready Mixed Concrete Association (NRMCA) and the Maryland Ready Mix Concrete Association (MRMCA), along with some other local contractors to explore the plant's contributions to low carbon concrete.

Quarry Life Award: Connecting Conservation and Community

Building community also means supporting the local partners who help us protect our shared environment. We're proud to celebrate the Indiana Karst Conservancy, winner of the Beyond Quarry Borders Award in the international Heidelberg Materials Quarry Life Award 2025 competition, for their work right in Mitchell, Indiana.

Their project focuses on the endangered Hoosier cavefish, a rare, blind species found only in southern Indiana. The research took place in historic Hamer Cave within Spring Mill State Park — land that became part of the park through a nearly 260-acre donation from Lehigh Cement in 1928. It's a great example of how long-standing community connections continue to support meaningful conservation work.

The Quarry Life Award brings together ideas from around the world, showing how mining sites can serve as important places for ecological research. This year's competition drew more than 130 proposals, with 56 carried out onsite.

For the Indiana Karst Conservancy, establishing a population baseline for the Hoosier cavefish helps guide future protection of the cave ecosystems near our Mitchell cement plant. Their efforts earned a €10,000 prize, presented during the award ceremony in Heidelberg, Germany.





Projects like this — rooted in science, community, and stewardship — help strengthen our connection to the places we call home.

Bringing the community to us



Northwest Region | Sechelt Quarry

In 2024, the Sechelt Quarry in British Columbia welcomed the community for a successful open house, offering neighbors an up-close look at quarry operations and future plans. Guests enjoyed guided quarry tours, equipment displays, and kid-friendly activities, including a large sandbox. The event also provided an opportunity for community members to review and learn more about the proposed mining permit update for the quarry.

Events like these are a great way to strengthen the relationship with the local residents and go a long way in demonstrating our **commitment to transparency and giving back to the communities where we operate.**



Midwest Region

For more than two decades, our Midwest Region Technical Services team has been conducting a Concrete School at different locations throughout the region to educate customers on the essentials of cement and concrete.
